#### In-year redistribution of student support funds for 2020-21

#### **Purpose**

1. This letter announces the in-year redistribution of student support funding from SFC to colleges for Academic Year (AY) 2020-21, and details the recovery and reallocation of unspent funds to support discretionary funding needs across the sector.

#### **Background**

- 2. Demand for student support is unpredictable and, in order to match annual SFC funding to demand as closely as possible, we carry out an in-year redistribution. Colleges are not permitted to use student support funding for purposes other than those specified, and we recover funds that colleges do not expect to use in the current year, as well as any unspent funds from the previous year. We use the funds returned to us to re-allocate to colleges that need additional student support in the current year.
- 3. SFC invited colleges to relinquish unspent student support funds or request an increase to their AY 2020-21 student support allocations in a 'Call for Information' published on 4 November 2020 (SFC/CI/10/2020: In-year management of student support allocations 2020-21).

#### COVID-19

- 4. COVID-19 and the lockdown restrictions associated with the global pandemic have presented significant challenges for the sector and its learners in AYs 2019-20 and 2020-21, and this has impacted on colleges' student support budgets.
- 5. Due to the college campus closures in mid-March 2020, colleges reduced their student support expenditure on travel and childcare costs, in line with lockdown restrictions. SFC published guidance on the Redirection of Travel and Childcare Costs support and increased flexibility in the use of FE Discretionary Funds to help meet students' financial needs during the pandemic. This increased flexibility enabled colleges to support more students in financial hardship, which resulted in a significant increase in their discretionary funding expenditure.
- 6. Despite the increase in discretionary funding expenditure, the savings in travel and childcare costs have led to an in-year position that will allow us to further support students through the changing COVID-19 situation.

#### Additional funding requested

- 7. The total amount of additional student support funding requested by colleges for AY 2020-21 is £1.6 million (as set out in Annex A, column 1). SFC will be able to meet those requests in full.
- 8. The table in Annex A details the amounts requested by each college/college region. The table shows the total additional funding to be paid out in AY 2020-21, along with a breakdown across the two Financial Years (FYs) 2020-21 and 2021-22.

#### Recovery of unspent funds and adjustments to budgets

- 9. Colleges receiving additional funds will have their 2020-21 student support budgets increased by the amount of additional funding that they have been allocated, as detailed in the table at Annex A. These updated budgets will be reflected in incorporated colleges' monthly cash-flow pro-forma. Colleges should continue to draw-down funding based on need, whilst giving due regard to their revised FY budget.
- 10. For multi-college regions, we have set out in Annex A the amounts requested by individual colleges within each region. Regional Strategic Bodies should note the allocations to individual colleges. Multi-college regions may action in-year transfers of student support funding between colleges within the region.
- 11. The table in Annex B details the amounts remaining from AY 2019-20 to be returned by each college/college region. Colleges that are returning unused funds will have their overall FY student support budget reduced by the amount of funding that they are returning. For those colleges that have already made adjustments to their budgets in July 2020, the March 2021 adjustment to be made will take into account the funds previously not drawn down. This is shown in Annex B, under the column 'Remaining funding adjustments to be made in March 2021'.
- 12. Newbattle Abbey College, SRUC, Orkney College, Shetland College and West Highland College do not submit cash-flow pro-formas. For these institutions, unused funds will be recovered in March 2021. Where these institutions are to receive additional funds, payments will be adjusted in March and April as set out in Annex A.
- 13. Colleges will not be able to claim funding above their revised budgets. #### Management of payment of funds

14. We will contact colleges in early June 2021 to seek clarification of their near final position on spend on student support in AY 2020-21. Colleges that have drawn down their full student support budget but are forecasting a significant underspend against their budget will be asked to reduce their July 2021 draw-down of funds or return surplus funds to SFC in July 2021, rather than waiting until the 2021-22 redistribution exercise in Autumn 2021.

# Repurposing and reallocation of unspent AY 2019-20 funds for COVID-19 discretionary funding

- 15. We recognise that this year has been extremely difficult for students. Restrictions on travel and campus closures have changed the way institutions deliver their courses and students are facing significant challenges in their studies due to the pandemic. Given existing lockdown restrictions and the increase in blended learning and online teaching provision, we understand the importance of learners being suitably equipped, digitally, to access such provision. In addition, the lack of seasonal temporary employment and the extended lockdowns have had a significant impact on students' finances. SFC is acutely aware of the importance of supporting students in their learner journey to succeed in their studies.
- 16. We are therefore repurposing £5 million of unspent student support funds to enable additional discretionary funding to be available to colleges for COVID-19 related support. This will enable colleges to further support those students who are finding themselves in financial hardship due to the pandemic. We will allocate this in line with the college/region's overall AY 2020-21 student support allocation.
- 17. Colleges can use their discretion when allocating this funding, taking into account personal circumstances when assessing students' financial situation. Colleges may also wish to use this allocation to tackle digital poverty and provide more students with the necessary IT equipment and technology they need to succeed in their current online learning environment.
- 18. Individual allocations can be found in Annex C of this announcement. For eligibility purposes colleges should refer to SFC's current <u>FE Discretionary Fund 2020-21</u> guidance. Following the recent Scottish Government announcement of additional funds to meet emergency student hardship, there will be a further allocation of funds that will be published separately.

## Conditions of grant and reporting requirements relating to reallocated AY 2020-21 funds

- 19. The reallocation of funding set out above, for additional discretionary support, must only be used for the purpose(s) for which they are being allocated. SFC retains the right to audit relevant documentation to satisfy itself that this is the case (and the institution undertakes that it will provide such assistance as SFC reasonably requires).
- 20. These funds are for AY 2020-21. Colleges/regions will be asked to report on their use of these funds after the end of AY 2020-21. Any unspent funds will be recovered as part of the AY 2021-22 In-year redistribution exercise.
- 21. SFC may recover funding if you do not comply with any of the conditions of grant or reporting requirements.
