### Intake targets for Dentistry in AY 2023-24

#### Purpose

1. I am writing to announce the university intake targets in the controlled subject of Dentistry for Academic Year (AY) 2023-24.

#### **Background**

2. SFC receives annual guidance from the Chief Dental Officer (CDO) and Dentistry Division, providing recommended intakes for dental schools in Scotland. This letter of guidance for AY 2023-24 is provided in Annex A.

#### Intake targets

- 3. SFC has received guidance from the CDO that, after extensive analytical work on the requirements of the dental workforce in Scotland, intake targets will return to their pre-COVID-19 levels. The intake target for Scottish Dental Schools in AY 2023-24 will be **155** with a recommended intake for Scottish-domiciled/'home fee', rest of UK (rUK) and Republic of Ireland (RoI) students of 135. This is shown in Table 1 below.
- 4. In AY 2022-23, the University of Dundee was allowed to recruit five rUK students with entry deferred to AY 2023-24. These students should be counted against the AY 2023-24 intake target.
- 5. Universities will be allowed to recruit international Dentistry students (see <u>Table 1</u>), but they will be expected to contribute towards ACT(D) via their student fees as previously agreed.

## **European Union students**

6. As a result of the United Kingdom leaving the European Union (EU) and the transitional period ending in January 2021, EU students without 'home fee' status, starting their courses in AY 2023-24, are not eligible for SFC funding. Rol students will also be ineligible for funding but will have access to a tuition fee loan via Student Awards Agency Scotland (SAAS) of up to £9,250 each year. Continuing EU students will continue to receive SFC funding.

## Funded student places

7. Funded student places for Dentistry were published in our <u>Final Funding Allocations for AY 2023-24</u>. If these funded places are significantly different from a university's internal modelling, then they should contact SFC to discuss as soon as possible. In future years we plan to share our modelling with universities in advance of publication.
