#### **Strategic direction on access from the SFC**

- <u>Strategic Plan</u> Outcome for high quality teaching and learning "We will have contributed to a more equal society because learning is accessible and diverse; attracting, and providing more equal opportunities for people of all ages, and from all communities and backgrounds in Scotland."
- <u>Outcome Agreement Framework</u> drives forward national and institutional ambitions in relation to access and equality and diversity
  - Age Opportunities for All
  - Disability Access and Inclusion Strategy / equality targets
  - o Gender Gender Action Plan
  - Socio-economic Targets for intake and achievement, additional places
  - o Care experience
  - Articulation <u>10 year plan</u> and additional places





#### SFC's Access policies – our next priorities

- Contextualised Admissions impact on fair access
- Schools national programme to deliver our access ambitions
- "At risk" groups
- Grow and expand articulation
- Develop our Gender Action Plan staffing including career progression, Boards/Court, transgender and violence against women
- Actions from a triennial review
  - Intersectionality outcomes by age and socio-economic
  - College sector promote good practice in early interventions through a detailed understanding of the reasons for withdrawl rates
  - $\circ~$  Use data to promote and understand the learner journey



#### **Enabling and support diversity**

#### Equality

- Outcome Agreements require Equality
  Impact Assessments
- Enables demonstrate of actions undertaken from PSED requirements
- National measures demonstrate our commitment to equality
- Includes consideration of protected characteristics and Care Experienced students and Carers

#### **Vulnerable/At risk Groups**

- Developing policy support for "at risk" groups including estranged students, community justice, young carers, transgender, kinship care, veterans and students from military families, refugees, and those with a mental health issue.
- Will look at:
  - how these groups access, participate, stay-on and progress in further and higher education
  - o what data needs to be gathered



### Targeted funding

#### **Access and Inclusion Fund**

- 2015-16: Review of Extended Learning Support (ELS) concludes funds would be better used by colleges to support inclusive practices.
- 2017-18 College Outcome Agreements asked college regions to develop a strategy that would evidence use and impact of the funds.

#### **Widening Access and Retention Fund**

- 2011-12: Regional Coherence fund created a £19M fund to support the delivery of coherent provision through articulation, with improved retention and flexible modes of study.
- 2014-15: Funding reviewed, embedded in the OA process, and renamed the Widening Access and Retention Fund to ensure increased emphasis on purpose of fund.
